America's # 1 Customer

Canada buys more from the U.S. than China or the entire European Union.

AGRICULTURE

- Canada buys \$8 BILLION in vegetable, fruits, and nuts
- We trade MORE BEEF AND PORK with each other than anyone else

SERVICES

- Bilateral trade in services totaled \$88 BILLION in 2015
- Travel-related services trade:
 \$25 BILLION
- Bilateral services trade has grown by 85% in the last 10 years



THAN DOES ANY OTHER NATION



MANUFACTURING

- The U.S. sells over \$80 BILLION in equipment and machinery to Canada
- The U.S. has A SURPLUS OF \$50 BILLION in this sector

ENERGY

- Canada is the MOST SECURE SUPPLIER OF ENERGY to the U.S.
- Canadian CLEAN HYDROELECTRICITY provides power to one million American homes
- Canada supplies the U.S. with over 40% of its CRUDE OIL IMPORTS

Canadian companies operating in the U.S. directly employ **500,000 Americans**

Canada-US Two-Way Trade

We trade over **USD \$720 billion** per year.



In other words, we trade an average of

\$1.3 MILLION

every minute of every day




Highlights: Canada's Impact on Florida

- Florida Exports \$7.7 Billion to Canada (goods & services)
- Florida Imports \$4.7 Billion from Canada (goods only)
- Canadians Purchase \$6 Billion in Real Estate (2014-2018)
- Canadian Businesses in Florida 500 Companies / 2,600 Locations
- 3.5 million annual visits to Florida by Canadians



Business Investment In Florida 500 Companies 2,600 Locations









Cooperation at the Border (1/2)

The U.S. and Canada share a long history of cooperation in combating threats and ensuring the legitimate flow of people and goods across our shared border

Meeting the demands of just-in-time delivery



Safely facilitating the daily flow of 400,000 people and over USD \$2 billion in goods and services





Cooperation at the Border (2/2)

- Temporary restriction in effect until June 21, 2020
- Healthy people who need to cross the border to go to work or for other essential purposes can do so
- Importance of continued collaboration at the border between our countries
- Canada Border Services Agency is actively working to ensure safety of Canadians and implementation of travel restrictions

Supply Chain During COVID-19 (1/2)

HEALTH SECTOR

- Shifting production (in Canada and in the US)
- Complex, integrated and reciprocal bilateral relationship on medical supplies
- Canada exempt from US PPE export ban
- Extensive supply chain interdependencies
- Examples:
 - Canadian medical furniture for field hospital in Miami Beach
 - Canadian biopharma supplying FL with equipment to develop a COVID-19 vaccine

- 1. Preserves access for exporters
- 2. Increases agriculture market access
- 3. Protects intellectual property

- 4. Updates auto rules of origin
- Preserves dispute settlement for trade remedies







USMCA: The new NAFTA (3/3)

- 6. Includes state of the art chapters for new and emerging industries
- 7. Puts SMEs front and center, including under-represented groups
- 8. Reduces red tape

9. Defends labour
